

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Report (HEERF): Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students CRRSAA Galveston College Quarterly Report – June 30, 2021 – <u>FINAL CRRSAA</u> <u>Student Report</u>

The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) is authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law 116-260, signed into law on Dec. 27, 2020. Institutions that previously were awarded CARES ACT funding were automatically awarded aid under CRRSAA. The drawdown of the available funding within G5 was an indication of acceptance of the award.

- 1. An acknowledgment that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA (a)(1) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
 - Galveston College signed and returned the Certification and Agreement form and assures that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than the required amount of funds received to provide HEERF grants to students.
- 2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) programs.
 - CRRSAA requires that an institution receiving funding under section 314(a)(1) provide the "same amount" in financial aid grants to students from the new CRRSAA funds that it was required or which it would have been required to provide under its original CARES Act Student Aid Portion award. The student portion of the CARES Act funding was \$606,113.00.
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and (a)(1) programs as of the date of submission.
 - As of June 30, 2021, Galveston College has distributed HEERF II CRRSAA funds in the amount of \$606,113.00 in direct payments to enrolled students. Disbursing the funds in its entirety.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and (a)(1) programs.
 - As of June 30, 2021, Galveston College has 2302 students eligible to apply for HEERF II CRRSAA funds.
- 5. <u>The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) programs.</u>
 - As of June 30, 2021, Galveston College has distributed HEERF II CRRSAA funds to 674 unduplicated students.
- 6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA (a)(1) programs.
 - The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive HEERF grants and how much they would receive. Unlike the CARES Act, the CRRSAA requires that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants, in awarding financial aid grants to students. However, students do not need to be only Pell recipients or students who are eligible for Pell grants. In addition, the CRRSAA

explicitly provides that financial aid grants to students may be provided to students exclusively enrolled in distance education.

The HEERF Emergency Fund Taskforce is comprised of three voting members and one ex-officio. The task force met on April 14, 2020, to determine the student application method, method of student notifications, eligibility amounts, and review process.

Emergency Funding Process:

- 1) Students must apply for funds through a formal application process (see Attachment A)
- 2) Text messages and emails were sent out to the enrolled population of students on beginning February 1, 2021, and ending June 25, 2021. (see Attachment B)
- 3) The application review may take 2-5 days to complete. Once approved by the Taskforce, the student is mailed a check. Checks are processed and mailed twice a week in accordance with the College's current business processes.
- 4) Maximum Amounts were determined by the Taskforce. Students were surveyed for a "Requested Amount"
- 5) The student receives an email with approval or denial of funds. Denial emails vary depending on the reason. (see Attachment C)

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Instructions, directions, and guidance were provided to students via text, email, and outlined on the application (outlined in the following attachments).

An email, cares@gc.edu, was created for students to direct their questions or concerns. The email is closely monitored and responded with 2 days.



CRRSAA Act Emergency Fund Application (HEERF II)

The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) grant is made possible by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act. 2021 (CRRSAA) signed into law on December 27, 2020. These funds are limited and do not need to be repaid. The funds may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. The grant funds will give priority to students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants. However, students do not need to be Pell recipients or students who are eligible for Pell grants in order to receive a financial aid grant.

All applications will be reviewed for eligibility and disbursed to students by check to the address on file with Admissions. Please check your address and make any changes on your Whitecaps Portal.

All status updates, request for more information, required forms, documents, offer notices, disbursement information, etc. will be sent to your Whitecaps email only. Eligibility Requirements:

Funding under the HEERF grant is available to ALL enrolled students who have Emergency Costs incurred due to coronavirus. Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is strongly encouraged Apply for Aid Here

Enrolled as a student at Galveston College




